

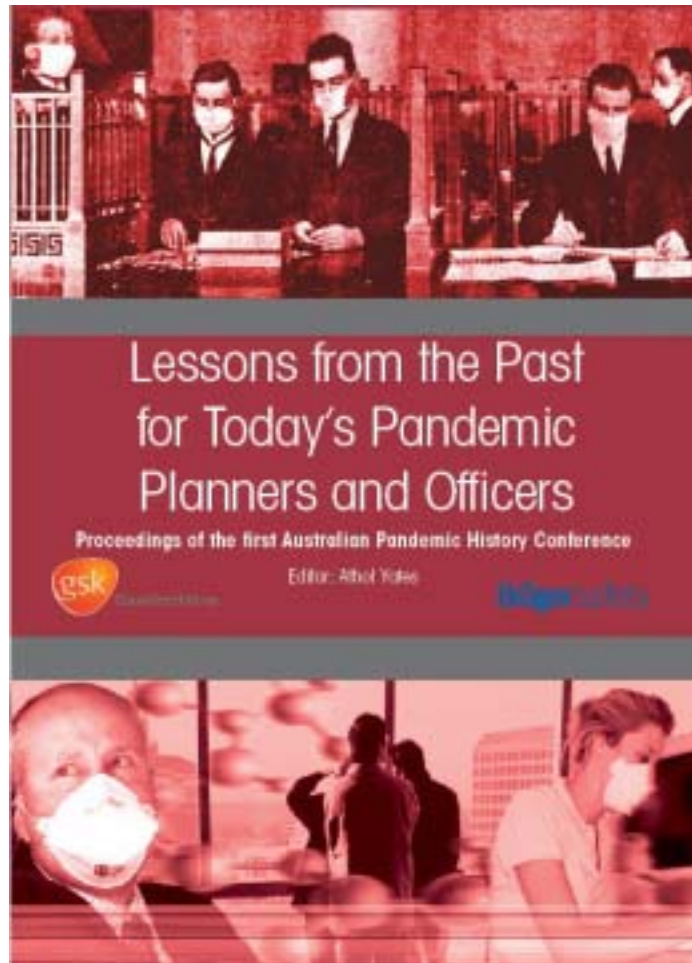
# Lessons from the Past for Today's Pandemic Planners and Officers: proceedings of the first Australian Pandemic History Conference
